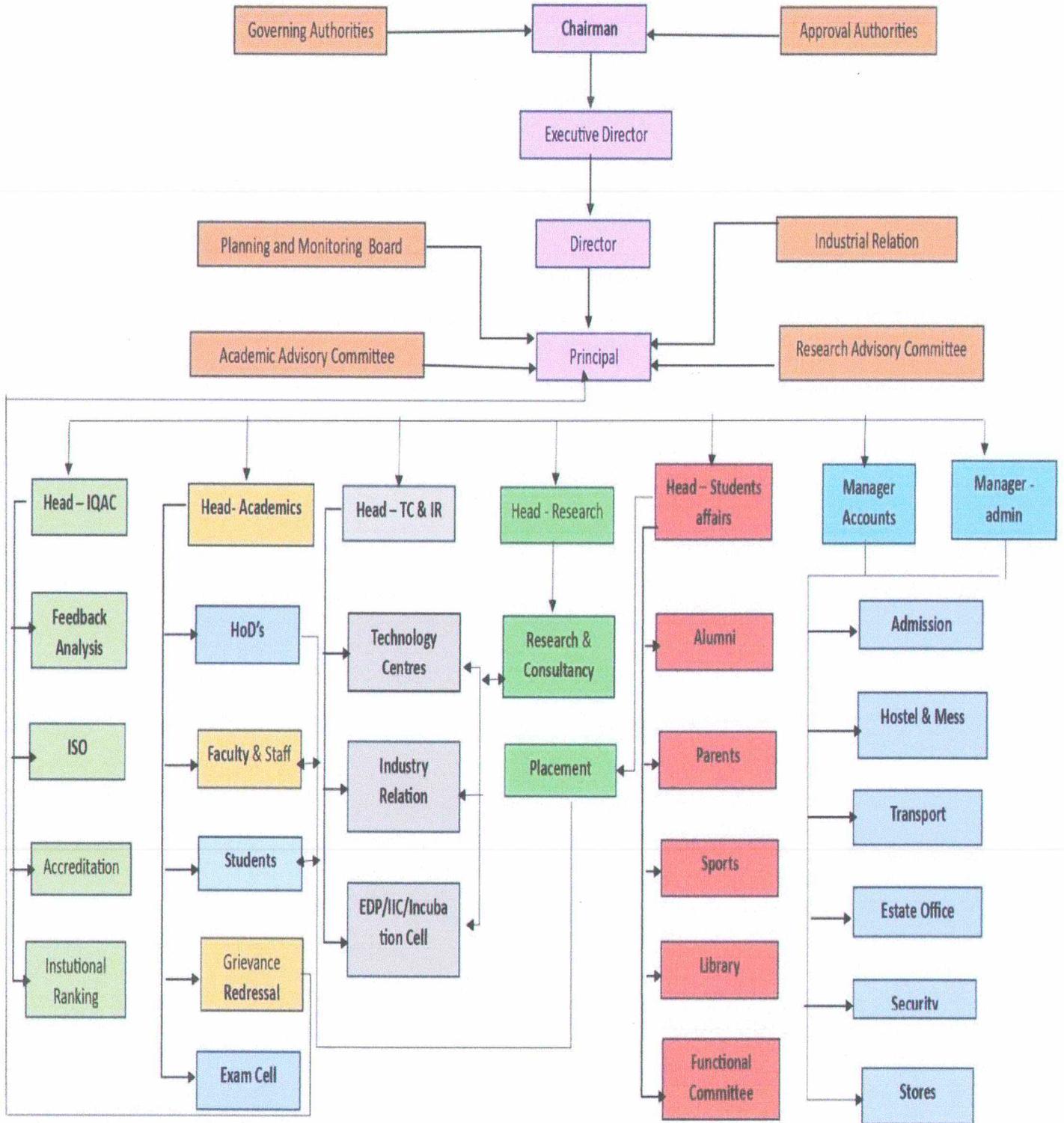

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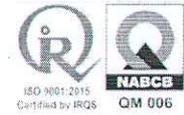

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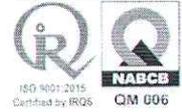


The following points were discussed in the meeting:

- ❖ Dr. S. Murugavel, Professor, TPGIT, Vellore suggested the following

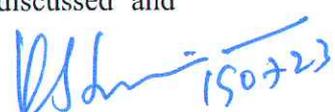
